**100 Trees for 100 Years –
1st Cobham Scout Group celebrates its Centenary Year with Tree
Planting Ceremony at Painshill Park
Saturday 30th January 2010**

On 30th January 2010 – 1st Cobham Scout Group launches its Centenary Celebrations with a Tree Planting Ceremony at Painshill Park, with his Worshipful Mayor of Elmbridge in attendance.

In August 1910 the village of Cobham was an early adopter of the Scouting Movement with the Scout Troop being established by a local Reverend in a small wooden hut at the top of Freelands Road. 1st Cobham Cub Pack joined them 10 years later, and Beavers were introduced in the 1980's. The Troop was relocated to 'new' brick built premises in Hogshill Lane in 1947 where the 3 Sections continue to meet today. Although there are no accurate records it is believed that over 3000 local children have benefited from being part of 1st Cobham Scout Movement since its inception.
